To issue search warrants. When magistrates issue a search warrant, they are giving a law enforcement officer authority to conduct a search to aid an official investigation. The officer seeking the search warrant must make a complaint, under oath, stating the purpose of the search to the magistrate.

Complete a bachelor's degree. All candidates for a magistrate position in South Carolina must have a bachelor's degree in the field of her choice.

Another way to become a magistrate or judge is to be nominated by someone. The person sending the nomination is required to lodge a submission with details of their name, address and contact number and the details of the nominee.

Becoming a Magistrate or Judge in NSW

Every person appointed as a magistrate on and after July 1, 2008, shall be required to have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher education. A person initially appointed as a magistrate prior to July 1, 2008, who continues in office without a break in service is not required to have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher education.

§ 19.2-37. Magistrates; eligibility for appointment ...

Magistrates do not need any specific legal training, nor do they sit exams. A magistrate undergoes mandatory training of about 3 and a half days before sitting in court, and will be allocated a mentor for their first year. After a magistrate has sat for 12 months, they will be regularly appraised by specially-trained magistrates.
